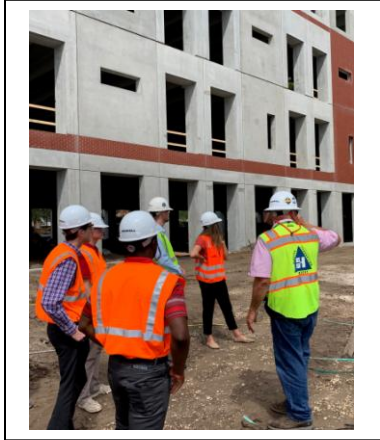


Ashley Saddler
