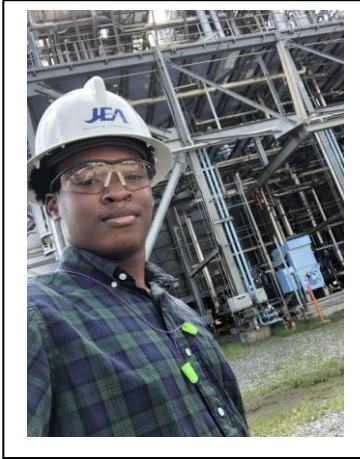


Maurice Henderson, II
